


Dear Citizen:

- Last, Will & Testament - Copy of the probated will (the original is retained with the Surrogate's Court.)
- Letters Testamentary – Attached to the front of the will copy are Letters Testamentary. Retain the Letters Testamentary with your records as this is proof of the date of probate of the will and the date of your appointment as Executor.
- Executor Short Certificate(s): _____ Used to show your authority as the executor of the estate and your authority to transfer assets, pay debt, etc. Please note that a Short Certificate is dated, some institutions may not accept s short certificate after 30 days from issuance.
- Receipt: Probate filing fee:
- Receipt other: _____
- Trust Clause: Pursuant to the Trust created in this Will, advise the Trustee to contact our office for completion of Trust documents for appointment.
- Notice of Probate & Proof of Mailing – N.J. state law (Rule 4:80-6) requires the Executor give notice of the probated Will.

Am I entitled to compensation for acting as Executor or Administrator? See N.J.S. 3B:18-14

Generally commissions on all corpus received by the fiduciary may be taken as follows:

5% on the first \$200,000.00 of all corpus received by the fiduciary;

3.5% on the excess over \$200,000.00 up to \$1,000,000.00;

2 % on the excess over \$1,000,000.

1% of all corpus for each additional fiduciary provided that no one fiduciary shall be entitled to any greater commission than that which would be allowed if there were but one fiduciary
